

GENERAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING CERTIFICATE (NQF1)

The General Education and Training Certificate (GETC) comprises the first band of the National Qualifications Framework (NQF1). GETC is the same as a NQF level 1 qualification. To acquire a General Education and Training Certificate, students need to obtain a minimum of 120 credits at AET level 4.

Entrance requirements:

- Certified copy of Identity Document (ID)
- All prospective students will be interviewed and write an entrance examination in order to be placed in the following AET levels.

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SENIOR CERTIFICATE (SC) QUALIFICATION

ATTEND SENIOR CERTIFICATE CLASSES
REGISTRATION FOR SENIOR CERTIFICATE
EXAMINATION IN MAY-JUNE EACH YEAR

APPROVED SUBJECTS FOR SENIOR CERTIFICATE (NQF4) EXAMINATION

- Candidates can register to write exams for one or more subjects that appears in the list below.
- You need to write six (6) subjects and pass at least five (5) subjects, and a maximum of six subjects in one year.
- You can register to write exams for only one subject and a maximum of six subjects in one year.

PLEASE NOTE: Candidates can only register for **Computer Applications Technology (CAT)** at an **CLC / institution that offers the subject and not online.**

WHO CAN WRITE THE SENIOR CERTIFICATE (NQF4) EXAMINATION SOUTH AFRICAN CITIZENS

- A person must be 21 years and older.
- Certified copy of Identity document (ID)
- Proof of address
- A certified copy of your previous results/ school report. (Passed ABET L4, GETC (NQF1)/ Grade 9/ Std 7 or higher or SC results.
- A recognised equivalent qualification obtained at NQF level 1, which requires two official languages.
- Persons with incomplete Senior Certificate.
- Persons with an incomplete National Senior Certificate and whose School Based Assessment (SBA) validity has expired.
- Only in exceptional cases, out of school youth who passed Grade 9 / ABET L4 or obtained a recognised equivalent qualification at NQF level 1, which requires two official languages and who are 18-20 years old, could not complete their school education, due to circumstances beyond their control, can apply to the Head, Western Cape Education Department to write the SC examination.

NON-SOUTH AFRICAN CITIZENS

- Certified copy of valid passport / visa or study permit.
- Copy of previous results or highest qualifications (These qualifications must be endorsed / certify by SAQA)
- Proof of address.

PASS REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SENIOR CERTIFICATE (SC)

Adult students 21 years and older and out of school youth 18–21 years entering the Sc without credits must:

- Offer a minimum of six (6) subjects selected from the list in this brochure
- Must include two (2) official languages, of which one must be the Language of Learning and Teaching (LOLT)
- One of the languages must be at Home Language level and the other at least at First Additional language level.
- Pass at least five subjects, provide:
 - Obtain at least 40% in three (3) subjects which include Home Language and 30% in the remaining two subjects of the SC subjects listed in this brochure.
 - Obtain a sub-minimum of 20% in the failed sixth subject in the final examination.
 - No aggregate requirement for candidates taking all six (6) Senior Certificate subjects.
 - One subject condonation at 20%, 30% or 40% is permitted if the candidate is short of one subject to obtain the qualification.
 - No immigrant concession will be granted

CONCESSIONS

- Concessions related to disabilities of reading, basic spelling, writing and mathematical disorder may be granted in accordance with White Paper 6 on Special Needs Education: Building an Inclusive Education and Training System, 2001. Expertise in relevant fields of disability.
- All request for concessions must be evaluated by the Provincial Education Department internal structures responsible for special education needs, as well as external professional registered expertise in the relevant fields of disability
